Peer mentoring: Its important rehabilitative role in reducing re-offending-Stuart Ware

Stuart came out of prison in 1997 and since then has run the Restore Support Network (formerly Restore 50plus), as well as obtaining a PhD. He advises the Dept. of Health and the National Offender Management Service on care and resettlement of older people due for release in the community. He has a wealth of knowledge about the value of mentoring and the positive outcomes it can produce.
