2017 Baldwins Kick Start Award

This annual award programme is for young entrepreneurs who have a good idea and would like to start their own business. The programme was established by Baldwins Accountants to find and develop the 'Youth Entrepreneurs' of the future.

The winner of the award will be given a grant of £10,000 coupled with £10,000 worth of mentoring and accountancy advice. Two runners-up will be presented with £5,000 worth of accountancy advice and mentoring fees over a period of one year.

It is open to young people aged between 18 and 25 who either have an idea and a business plan but are yet to start trading, or newly founded start-up businesses where trading commenced on or after 31st August 2016.

Applications for the current round close on 31st August 2017.

Resilient Heritage

Resilient Heritage awards grants between £3,000-£250,000 to help strengthen organisations that want to build their capacity or achieve strategic change to improve the management of heritage in the long term.

Grants can fund activities to help acquire new skills or knowledge, or new models of governance, leadership and business to put the organisation in a better position for the future.

Examples of what can be supported:

- New staff posts to deliver the project
- Extra hours for existing staff to deliver the project
- The cost of filling a post left empty by moving an existing member of staff into a post created for the project
- Training and development costs
- Professional fees
- Equipment and materials
- Evaluating a project

This is a continuous rolling programme.

And It's Goodnight From Me...

Central Social and Recreational Trust

The Trust aims to enable disadvantaged children under the age of 21 to access facilities for recreational or other leisure time occupations.

Grants will generally be no more than £1,000 although the Trustees will consider applications above this figure in exceptional circumstances.

Applicants must state what they have done to fulfil the need from other sources.

Sports clubs and organisations that are affiliated to their governing body, ie Amateur Boxing Association of England, National Association of Clubs for Young People, Football Association, are eligible to apply.

Due to limited funds, the Trust is currently giving priority to the following applications for equipment:

Amateur Boxing Clubs

Amateur Martial Arts clubs

Youth Services providing a social and community service

Applications may be submitted at any time.

Lush Cosmetics' Charity Pot

Lush's Charity Pot is the company's main source of raising charitable funds. Alongside this, they support specific campaign groups by selling limited edition products specifically designed with each cause in mind.

In 2007, Lush created their Charity Pot body cream, 10 years later the Charity Pot fund is still going strong with 100% of the retail price being given to grassroots organisations in the areas of animal protection, human rights and environment conservation.

The initiative offers funding from £100 to £10,000 non-profits and has globally raised over £20 million till date. The average grant is £4,000.

Lush prefer to support projects with long term aims that address the root cause of social issues- although funding is provided for aid and support, such as animal shelter, refugee support and advice groups. Their website contains thorough guidelines for successfully applying as well as an online application process. Upon submitting your application, it takes around 6-8 weeks to find out if it has been successful and applications are usually reviewed at the end of each month. As always, read the guidelines thoroughly and aim to put in an application at least three months before the project starts.

One Stop Carriers for Causes

One Stop awards grants up to £1,000 to local non-profit organisations and groups for projects that benefit local communities within two miles of a One Stop store.

The scheme is funded through the money raised from the 5p bag charge. Projects must meet at least one of the following outcomes:

- Improving the lives of young people
- Improving the lives of the elderly
- Promoting physical activity
- Improving health or well being
- Increasing community safety
- Protecting/improving the local environment
