## Arts Council England Celebrating Age

This fund aims to support cultural spaces and other organisations to be open, positive and welcoming places for older people and to take high quality arts and culture into places where older people will find it easier to engage. Grants are available between £50,000 and £100,000 for collaborative working, audience engagement, developing relationships, commissioning work and developing spaces - arts, cultural and otherwise. Applicants must be working in partnership in a consortium with one lead organisation. To be eligible to apply, the lead applicant needs to be Arts Council funded, or have presented work to the public through one of the Arts Council's programmes.

**Applications must be submitted by 13th October 2016.**

## Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) Endowment Fund

Heritage Endowments grants are available to organisations in the UK who they are currently funding or have funded in the past. This is a match funding scheme – where the HLF grant matches every pound raised by grant recipients. You can apply for a Heritage Endowments grant of £250,000, £500,000 or £1million, to be matched £1:£1 by private donations you raise. Payments of the award will be made when evidence of the matched funding can be shown. You will need to register online and submit a project enquiry form by 13th October 2016. You will need to complete and submit your application, along with supporting documents, by 24th November 2016.

# Lush Charity Pot Funding

The majority of the funding is allocated to small, grassroots groups that are often best placed to make a real difference with limited resources and often struggle to find funding. They support small, grassroots organisations around the world working in the following areas: environment; animal protection; and human rights. As a campaigning company they particularly look for projects that create long-term change. Grants range from a few hundred pounds to a maximum of £10,000 per project. The average grant is around £4,000.

# Jeans for Genes Day/Genetic Disorders UK Grant Programme

The Jeans for Genes Day/Genetic Disorders UK Grant Programme 2017 is providing grants of up to £5,000 for projects that make a tangible difference to children and families affected by genetic disorders. Projects must:


- Benefit children (18 years or under) affected by genetic disorders
- Be of one year's duration or less
- Take place in the UK and/or will benefit UK families
- Have tangible and identifiable activities
- Have a child protection policy in place (if applicable) UK registered charities or UK based patient groups working with children (18 or under) affected by genetic disorders may apply.

Applications will be accepted from:

- Patient groups working on behalf of children and families affected by a genetic disorder if they are endorsed by a medical professional with recognised expertise in the disorder
- Charities and patient groups that support both adults and children as long as the focus of the grant is on children
- Special needs organisations, such as special schools or playgroups that provide services to children with a wide range of conditions as long as children affected by genetic disorders are the main beneficiaries of the project.

**Applications will be accepted until 30th September 2016 (midnight).**

# Momentum Music Fund

The Momentum Music Fund is a financial resource for talented artists and bands to help further their careers. The Fund covers a broad range of contemporary popular genres, including innovative and emerging genres. The programme has an overall budget of £500,000. Individual grants of between £5,000 and £15,000 will be awarded. Grants can be used to assist with any activity that significantly contributes to the development of an artist or band.

The Fund is open to applications from artists and bands in England that are at a crucial point in their development, with the potential to significantly further their career within the next two years. Applications can be submitted by the artists themselves or those who are working on their behalf, e.g. a manager, an independent label or publisher.

# Royal British Legion's External Grants Programme

The Royal British Legions offers funding of up to £50,000 for specialised projects or services for serving and/or ex-Service personnel and/or their families that are not already being provided by the Legion and that are in line with the Legion's funding priorities. The priorities are:

- Employment and training
- Family support
- Homelessness and outreach
- Supporting the elderly

Applications will be considered from charitable organisations that have been operating for at least two years. Faith based organisations may apply as long as their activities do not promote religion or include elements of proselytisation.

# Lloyds Bank Foundation for England and Wales - Invest Programme Open

The Lloyds Bank Foundation for England and Wales provides funding to enable charities and C.I.O.'s in England or Wales to break or prevent the cycle of disadvantage.

The Invest Programme's funding is intended for longer term core or direct delivery funding for charities which are delivering clear outcomes as a result of their work with people experiencing multiple disadvantage at one of the critical points in their life.

Funding is available for core organisational costs which are related to the day to day running of the charity. Consideration will only be given to requests for core costs where over 50% of the charity's work and expenditure meets the Foundation's criteria. Funding is also available for costs associated with the direct delivery of the charity's work.

Grants are available for between £10,000 and £25,000 per year for two or three years, with the opportunity for continuation funding for a further period of up to six years in total.

# The Henry Smith Charity Changes to Grant Making Programmes

The Henry Smith Charity is carrying out a full review of its grant making programmes. There have already been some changes, and there will be more to follow in 2017. The recent changes affect the Main Grants Programme.

The **Main Grants Programme** is for Revenue grants of £10,000 a year and over. Grants can be for up to three years for things like running costs (including salaries and overheads), or the running costs of a specific project (including staffing costs). The trustees are unlikely to make grants to organisations with income of £5 million or above.

**From now on, applications will no longer be accepted for:**

- Capital projects;
- Projects focusing on healthcare and hospices;
- Projects specifically targeted at supporting ex-servicemen and women.
